Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program

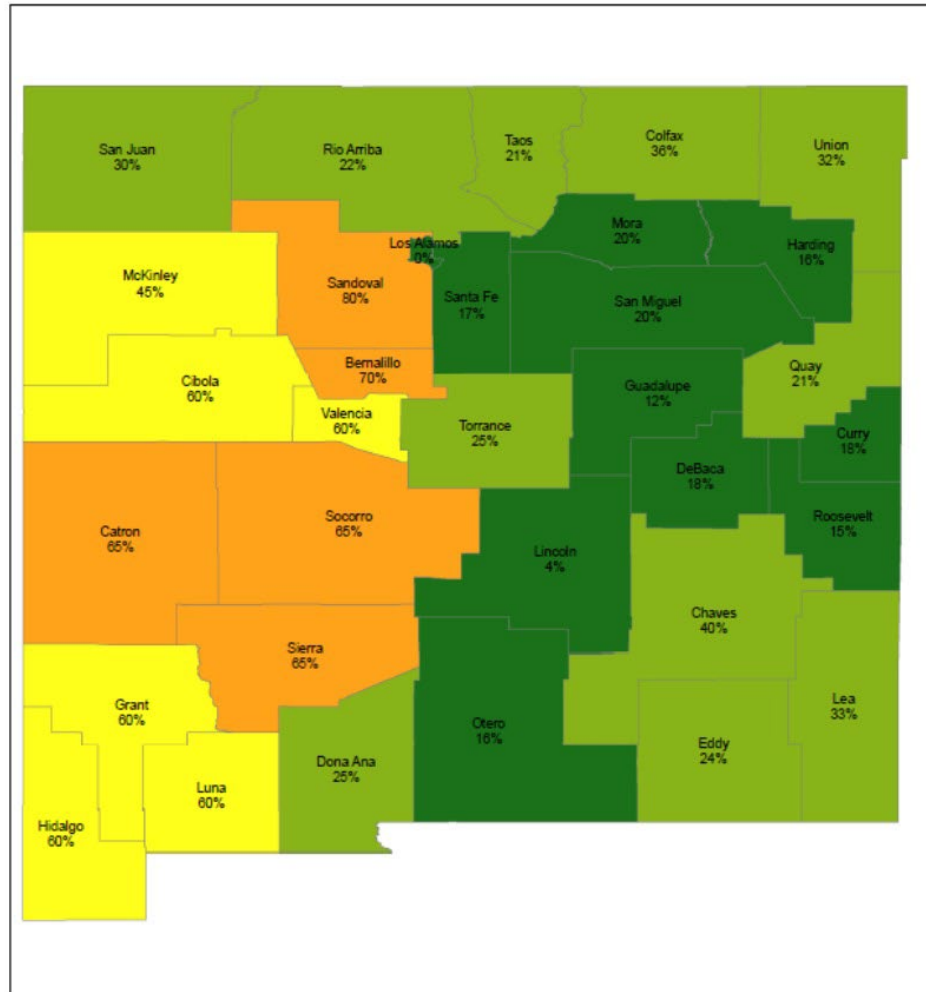
NAP

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP)

Provides financial assistance for non-insurable crop losses due to a natural disaster after a 50% loss. For Native Grass:

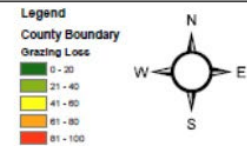
- ▶ Must be enrolled in program before growing season starts
- ▶ **Deadline is December 1st every year**
- ▶ No fee for Socially Disadvantaged, Limited Resource, Beginning Farmer/Rancher
- ▶ For Native Grass (range land) this program only covers grass loss not any livestock.

Livestock Forage Disaster Program

LFP

Livestock Forage Program (LFP)

Provides compensation for livestock feed losses.

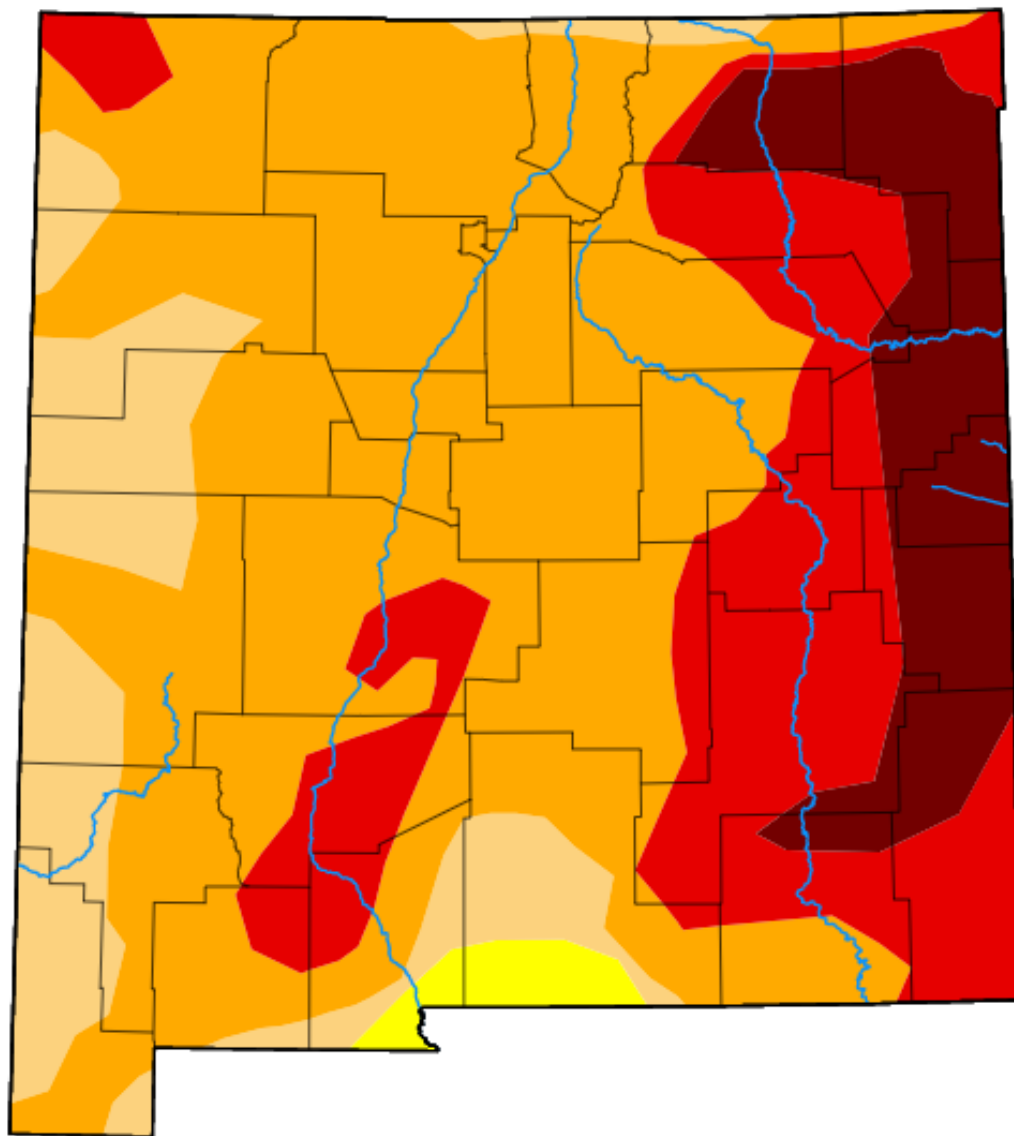
How a producer is eligible:

- ▶ The County the livestock graze on must be in a D2 drought status for 8 weeks consecutively according to the US Drought Monitor. D3 or higher- automatically eligible.
- ▶ Rancher must have owned livestock 60 days prior to County becoming eligible.
- ▶ Rancher must have a current permit, lease or deed verifying ranching operation

Livestock Forage Program (LFP)

What applicants need to apply:

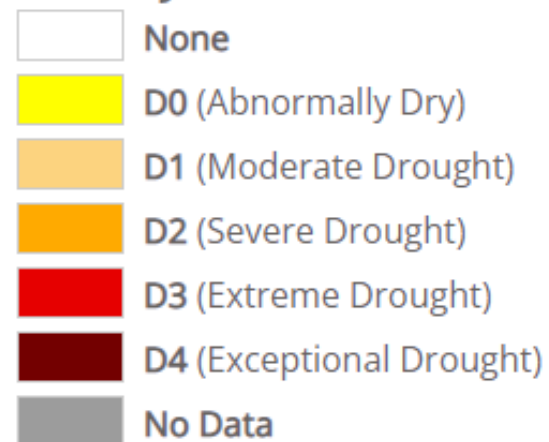
- ▶ Deed, lease, permit (current LFP year)
- ▶ Map of grazing area
- ▶ Livestock numbers and type- tax records, personal ledgers, tally count, RECORDS.
- ▶ Acreage report filed by deadlines.
- ▶ Eligibility forms- CCC-902, AD-1026, CCC- 941 AGI, AD-2047.

Emergency Livestock Assistance Program

Emergency Livestock Assistance Program (ELAP)

Provides compensation due to natural disasters. Livestock **WATER HAULING** is included.

How is a producer eligible:

- ▶ The County where the livestock are located must be in a D3 Drought Status according to the US Drought Monitor.
- ▶ Rancher must have owned livestock 60 days prior to County becoming eligible.
- ▶ Must provide County Office with water bills, hired labor receipts, and/or equipment rental receipts.
- ▶ Must provide County Office with producer management practices

Examples: Calendar, pocket notebook, electronic ledgers that list ranch practices

Compensation will not exceed more than 150 days of water hauling.

Limited to rangeland only. Cropland is ineligible

Additional Qualifications

- ▶ Must be a water source available in rangeland/pasture
 - ▶ Examples: natural spring, earth dirt tank, pond, etc.
- ▶ Normal water source must have gone dry due to qualifying drought
- ▶ Wells that went dry during qualifying drought may be eligible
- ▶ If water hauling is a normal management practice, you are not eligible to sign up for ELAP Water Hauling.

LDP Agreements

Loan Deficiency Payments



Producer Eligibility Requirements

- ▶ Have beneficial interest in the eligible commodity for which a LDP is requested
- ▶ Shares in the risk of producing the applicable commodity
- ▶ Have both control of the commodity and title to the commodity
- ▶ Own the sheep that produced the wool for at least 30 days before shearing.



Documents for eligibility

- CCC-902 Farm Operating Plan
- CCC-941 Average Adjusted Gross Income
- AD-1026 Highly Erodible and Conservation and Wetland Certification
- CCC-633ez Page 1 filed before beneficial loss of wool, **(before you sell)** Form can be filed at any FSA Service Center:
- San Juan Service Center in Aztec, NM
- Gallup Service Center in Gallup, NM
- Apache Service Center in St. Johns, AZ
- San Juan Service Center in Monticello, UT

After the Wool is sold,
you will receive a receipt.

- ▶ Take the Receipt to the FSA Service Center where you filed CCC-633ez Page 1
- ▶ Service Center will look for Page 1, and have you sign Page 4 for payment request.
- ▶ All other eligibility forms can be filed at the Service Center where you take your receipt.
- ▶ Page 1 can be filed for next year, and you will be ready next year.
